The Lincoln Park School District receives federal funds through the No Child Left Behind Act (NCLB) grant program in four different areas:

Title I	\$ 106,585	Improving Basic Programs
Title II A	\$ 17,227	Professional Development Fund
Title III	\$ 10,099	English Language Acquisition Enhancement

Total \$ 133,911

The law requires that all schools receiving federal funds must inform parents of their right to ask schools about the qualifications of their children's teachers. Our school receives federal funding and we are happy to share this information with you.

We believe that nothing is more important to your child's education than having well-prepared and highly qualified teachers. The legal definition of a "highly qualified teacher" has three parts. It states that the teacher must have the following:


1. A four-year college degree;
2. A regular teaching certificate/license; and
3. Proof of their knowledge in the subject they teach.

All of our teachers have college degrees and many have advanced degrees. The State of New Jersey has always required a teaching certificate/license for all teachers. In addition, every teacher continues his or her own learning through professional development activities, and our teachers are evaluated each year to make sure that their teaching skills remain at the highest possible level. The Lincoln Park School District is happy to report that all members of the teaching staff are highly qualified and meet the requirements set forth by the New Jersey Department of Education.
